Entry Tags: Tags must be completed by the contestant when leaving off the entry. Entry tags will be available at each pick up point and the Maple Festival Exhibit Hall. Entry tags must be completed by the exhibitor and the correct contest class noted. The Maple Festival assumes no responsibility for errors by exhibitors. **All entries become the property of the Maple Festival and no containers or dishes can be returned to the exhibitor**. Syrup containers will not be returned. ***If you are mailing your entry, please be sure to include a paper with your entry with the following information: Name, Address, Phone, email. The grade of product can be a sticker on the top of the jug.

MAPLE SYRUP & MAPLE PRODUCTS CONTEST

The Vermont Maple Syrup and Maple Products contest, which is held annually at the Maple Exhibit Hall, is the largest maple contest in Vermont. The winners of this contest deserve to be recognized as having made the "Best of Vermont", a laudable achievement in a state already known for the outstanding quality of its maple products. The 2024 maple syrup contest will include the top three-color classes of Grade A syrup, using Vermont Grade Standards: Golden Maple – Delicate Taste, Amber Maple – Rich Taste, and Dark Maple – Robust Taste.

All maple syrup entries require **one-pint** containers, all other classes are to be in the quantity indicated. We ask that **no identifying labels or private label containers** are used for your contest entries. All maple syrup entries must be graded by the entrant. Contest entrants must be residents of Vermont.

Class and Product category

- 1. Maple Syrup, Golden Maple Delicate Taste
- 2. Maple Syrup, Amber Maple Rich Taste
- 3. Maple Syrup, Dark Maple Robust Taste
- 4. Pure Maple Sugar Cakes, 5 small cakes
- 5. Pure Maple Cream, 8 oz. clear glass or plastic container
- 6. Pure Maple Fudge, 8 oz. (may contain nuts)
- 7. Maple Granulated Sugar, 8 oz. clear glass or plastic container

Rules and Entry Procedures

Entering the Maple Syrup and Maple Products Contest is easy! Pick out your best 2024 Syrup, Maple Cream, Maple Candy, Fudge, and prepare to enter the contests at the 57th Annual Vermont Maple Festival.

NEW CHANGES

Syrup will be delivered on the appointed day to the Vermont Maple Festival, where all syrups entered are carefully evaluated by an experienced panel of Maple Judges

Entries per operation: Maple syrup or product entries can be made in the name of any employee or family member, but **no more than one** entry per class per farm will be accepted.

*Violation of this rule section may result in disqualification of all the contestants' entries.

Judging: All entries will be judged by a team of judges on Wednesday April 24th, beginning at 10AM. No one is permitted in the judging area during judging (except for the judges and their assistants). All contest rules must be followed exactly, and decisions of the judges are final.

- 1. All entries will be judged for each criteria even though you may get disqualified in one:
 - a. Density
 - b. Color
 - c. Flavor
 - d. Clarity

Contestants will be notified of the reason for any disqualification by the contest chair but will receive all results on each criteria. Only Pure Vermont Maple Syrup may be used in the preparation of any entry.

Awards:

- 1. "Excellent" Blue ribbons are awarded to those who have met the 4 categories being judged on:
 - a. Density, color, flavor.
- 2. "Outstanding" Blue Ribbons awarded to the syrup that met the 4 categories and stands out as an entry that may qualify for Best of Class.
- 3. "Best of Class" Blue Ribbon Rosette will be given to one entrant that is chosen to be superior in each of the 7 classes.
- 4. The "**Best of Show**" is given to the top Maple Syrup entry and will receive the coveted <u>C. Blake Roy award!</u>(C. Blake Roy was involved in the Field Days as a judge for many years with a special interest in Quality control, this award is given in his honor).

All entries judged to be "Excellent" in each class will receive a Blue Ribbon and \$10.00. Entries judged to be "Outstanding" in each class will receive a Blue Ribbon and \$15. "Best of Class" winners will be presented an additional \$10, a rosette.

The Best of Show winner in the Maple Syrup Contest is chosen from Class winners. The winner shall receive a special \$50 award in memory of C. Blake Roy.

There will be a display showcasing all entries and the top winners at the Exhibit Hall. If you have any questions, you can email info@vtmaplefestival.org and someone will reach out to you. There also will be a letter sent to all entries after the Maple Festival with your ribbons & checks, and information if your entry was disqualified. If you are at the Festival on Sunday and would like to pick up your ribbon and check, please come to the Exhibit Hall and someone will help you.
